Purpose of Discussion Paper / Today

- Tasked with considering MVCA's future
- Lots of questions could be posed
- Provide everyone with consistent baseline information
- Initiate discussion
- Identify community needs and priorities
- Identify appropriate niche for MVCA
- Inform development of the Land Conservation Strategy

Conservation Authorities

Who are we?

- Not for profit governmental agencies created by the province.
- 36 CAs across the province
- Formed at the request of local municipalities
- Governed by municipal representatives:
 - MVCA was established in 1968 at the request of local municipalities.
 - Originally comprised of 29 municipalities. Post amalgamation: 11 municipalities
 - MVCA funded by those municipalities as well as user fees and grants.
 - MVCA Board meets at least 9 times annually.
 - Updates provided to municipalities following every meeting.
- Support interjurisdictional planning and cooperation on issues of shared interest at watershed level.

Legislated Mandate

1. Mitigate risks associated with natural hazards

- Flooding
- Erosion
- Unstable soils (marine clays)
- Unstable slopes (riverine and other)

How?

- Identifying and mapping hazards
- Regulating alterations/development within those areas
- Commenting on planning applications within those areas
- Operating and maintaining water control structures
- Operating a flood forecasting and warning (FFW) system

Legislated Mandate

2. Protect the hydrologic functioning of wetlands

How?

- Identifying and mapping wetlands
- Regulating alterations/development within those areas

3. Source Water Protection

How?

- Assisting with the implementation of Source Water Protection Plans
- Only in communities with municipal drinking water systems: Carleton Place, Almonte, and Carp

Legislated Mandate

4. Conservation and management of land

"further the conservation, restoration, development and management of natural resources"

How?

- Acquiring or otherwise managing land for conservation or preservation.
- Collecting, analyzing, and providing baseline water quality data on behalf of the province.

Direction Setting

O. Reg. 686/21 requires CAs to:

- Inventory and assess their properties (own or have a legal interest in)
- Conduct a needs assessment and gap analysis of their programs and services
- Develop a policy framework for delivery of programs and services and land management:
 - Conservation Area Strategy (WIP)
 - Watershed-based Resource Management Strategy (WIP)

This project will meet the regulatory requirements.

MVCA Land Interests: Conservation



Own 4 conservation areas:

- Mill of Kintail
- Purdon
- Palmerston-Canonto
- 35km of K&P Trail



Lease 2 properties from the City of Ottawa:


- Morris Island
- Carp River Restoration Area


MVCA Land Interests: Water Control





- MVCA owns 12 water control structures.
- Most do not provide significant flood control
- None are used for power generation.
- Most on public lands with easements across public and private property, including Municipal Shoreline Allowances.
- MVCA also operates 2 OPG facilities and 6 MNR facilities.





Conservation vs. Preservation

Question: What role should MVCA play in land conservation within its jurisdiction?

- Conservation versus preservation
 - Hydrologic function / control
 - Ecological features / functions
- MVCA's current properties
 - Conservation areas
 - Dams
 - Other
- Who else operates in this space.
 - Other levels of government: municipal, county, provincial and federal
 - NGOs
 - Private landowners



Acquiring Land

Question: Should MVCA acquire more land for conservation purposes?

MVCA at present

- Own
- Lease/License (agreements with owners to use land)
- Conservation Agreement (long term agreements to manage/protect land)
- Land and Forest Management Agreements (contracted service)
- Stewardship Agreement (short term related to grants such as Rural Clean Water, ALUS, Trees Canada)

- Provincial Tax Incentive Programs (conservation/forest)
 - CLTIP portions of private property that have eligible natural heritage features may qualify for a 100% property tax exemption.
 - *MFTIP* a property tax reduction to eligible landowners who prepare and follow an approved Managed Forest Plan.
- NGOs (Ducks, MMLT, NCC)
- Other levels of government: municipal, county, provincial and federal

Facility Types

Question: What type of facilities should MVCA operate?

MVCA at present

- Passive recreation trails, boardwalks parking lots, washrooms, signage, shelters
- Active recreation basketball court, playground
- Cultural/Heritage Museum, Education Centre, Gate House, picnic shelter, Cloister

Other Conservation Authorities

- Managed forests
- Portage routes
- Scenic Lookouts/Rest-stops
- Camp sites and campgrounds
- Boat Launches

- Private sector
- NGOs (Ducks, MMLT, NCC)
- Other levels of government: municipal, county, provincial and federal

Permitted Uses

Question: What type of uses should MVCA permit at its Conservation Areas?

MVCA at present (in addition to facilities mentioned previously)

- Fred P. Lossing Observatory
- Men's Shed and Ramsay Women's Institute Tea on the Lawn
- Mississippi Field Naturalist Clubs and local Scouts and Guides programming
- Summer camps
- Rentals for Orienteering races, festivals, filming movies

Other Conservation Authorities

- Ice rinks and groomed cross-country ski trails
- Dedicated mountain bike trails
- Tree top trekking and zip-lining
- Watercraft rentals
- Music and related entertainment
- Native tree and plant nurseries

- Private sector
- Other levels of government: municipal, county, provincial and federal

Water Control Infrastructure

Question: How should MVCA approach the acquisition and use of water control structures?

<u>History</u>

- 12 structures acquired between 1973 and 1990 when MVCA 85% funded by province (O&M and capital). Today less than 3% O&M, and maximum of 50% for capital renewal.
- Most lie on Crown land or must be accessed by Crown, municipal or private land.

Purpose of MVCA Structures

- Flood control (significant reservoir capacity)
- Flood mitigation (some reservoir capacity)
- Habitat Management (supports spawning, primarily of cold water species)
- Recreational levels

Other Water Control Structures

- Hydro generation, e.g. High Falls, OPG
- MNR and private landowner dams and weirs

- Private sector
- Other levels of government: municipal, county, provincial and federal
